II. Background Information

About Somalia

Over the last 20 years, Somalia has suffered intense armed conflict. The country has a complex political and security profile, and is beset by poverty, natural disasters, recurring famine and violent conflict. For the Federal Government of Somalia (FGoS) to fulfil its mandate and meet the expectations of the Somali people, the government must strengthen its public sector institutions capacities at all levels.

III. Activities / Key Results Expected

Contextual information:

In 2012, the Federal Government of Somalia (FGoS) identified the issue of disengagement of Al-Shabaab combatants as an area of concern. Together with partners, including the International Organization for Migration (IOM), the FGoS embarked on a process to develop the "National Program on the Treatment and Handling of Disengaged Combatants and Youth at Risk" (National Program). Its objective is to establish a comprehensive process that allows for low-risk ex-fighters from Al-Shabaab to reintegrate in communities and become productive citizens. In spite of the achievements made through sensitizing both disengaged combatants and the public at large about the benefits of community security, peace and reintegration, there are current capacity gaps. IOM's Disarmament, Demobilization and Reintegration (DDR) Programme, which began in 2013 is an integral part of IOM programs in Somalia and has continued to play a decisive role in the post-conflict landscape.

In spite of the achievements made through sensitizing both DDR participants and the public at large about the benefits of community security, peace and reintegration, there are current capacity gaps which are preventing the FGoS from independently managing a holistic reception, rehabilitation and reintegration process. These critical gaps include a lack of understanding and awareness of the National Program by potential defectors and the general public. Thus it has been recognized by both IOM and Government partners that more needs to be done to ensure widespread support and to engage local stakeholders including the Somali public as active participants in the process of disengaging and reintegrating of former fighters. The Ministry of Internal Security, with support from IOM's DDR Program, is seeking a professional and experienced Strategic Communications Expert. Under the overall guidance of The Ministry of Internal Security, specifically the Defectors Rehabilitation Program (DRP), the Strategic Communications Expert will be responsible for the following duties and responsibilities:

- Coordinating and managing all strategic communications of the ministry, including IOM's portfolio of strategic communications programs in line with the National Program and Ministry needs.
- Effectively communicate policies and new initiatives to local domestic and international audiences;
- Advising the Minister and Director of the DRP Program on the most effective communication medium;
- Coordinating and supervising press conferences, media briefings and interviews;
- Writing and editing press releases and briefing papers for the Ministry's external exposure;
- Conduct direct interviews with partners and beneficiaries and produce multimedia content;
- Any other duties that may be assigned by the Ministry.

The Strategic Communications Expert, in collaboration with other information and communications officers in the Ministry will support the Ministry of Internal Security's Defectors Rehabilitation Program (DRP) in all internal and external communication needs. He/she will be expected to advise the Director of the Defectors Rehabilitation Program (DRP) on communications and information related activities.

IV. Target Outputs (Measurable Results)

- Conduct an initial gap analysis of current capacity and communication needs in the Ministry of Internal Security's Defectors Rehabilitation Program (DRP) and provide a list of cost-effective recommendations in training, capacity building, and equipment;
- Support the design and implementation government communication strategies
- Train Government officials on media liaison, outreach activities and channels of communication including video, photography and multimedia;
- Mentor communication staff;
- Initiate and sustain coordination between all government communication units and professionals to enhance unified messaging and to avoid duplication of effort;
- Produces a workplan at the beginning of assignment, quarterly reports and one final report highlighting achievements, challenges and recommendations (see below requirements for more information).

V: Requirements

Besides the specific outputs mentioned in section IV, the following steps/actions are to be undertaken throughout the assignment. These are standard requirements for all assignments undertaken through this project:

- 1. Transfer of skills: One of the main responsibilities of the qualified Somali expatriate, and one which he/she will be measured against, will be to ensure continuous and systematic transfer of knowledge and skills as related to the assignment. It will have to be agreed with the beneficiary institution which civil servants will have to benefit from this knowledge.
- 2. Work plan: A work plan will have to be developed with the Supervisor during the first week of assignment which will provide clear and time bound activities to successfully implement the outputs of the assignment. This work plan will be shared with the IOM DDR Project Officer. This work plan can be revised during the mid-term review to reflect new developments or changes in strategy.
- 3. Mid Term Review: there will be a mid-term review of the assignment between the incumbent and the

beneficiary institution to discuss progress of the assignment and feedback on performance.

4. Interim and Final Reports: A progress report will be submitted by the incumbent to the Supervisor and to the IOM DDR Project Officer. Thereafter a final report will be provided at the end of assignment.
